On the border, I used the golden lace which complemented the work on my lehenga. Velvet has a rich texture and hence, makes for a wonderful fabric of choice to go with your designer lehenga. Seguin Seguins are always hot and they can pep up the look of any outfit. You can wear the simplest of lehenga or saree with a sequin blouse, the look will be utterly glamorous. I have a thing for lehengas, I think they are perfect for all body types and you can wear them to any occasion, where you want to get an elaborate look.
